# Los Caballos Horse Camp

If the following information is correct the civil code included may be applicable.

Los Caballos Horse Camp in Cuyamaca State Park sustained minor damage in the Wildfires of 2004 including the loss of the restrooms. If the water was turned back on and porta potties set up, this public campground would be fully operational.

This horse camping area has been historic to San Diego County and the California Riding and Hiking Trail for over half a century. It serves the majority of equestrians in San Diego and surrounding counties. To date State Parks have unnecessarily obstructed public use of the campground pending major and expensive renovation. The minor repairs are exempt from CEQA and NEPA. The proposed major renovations under the FEMA grant may require an EIR.

With the minor above-mentioned repairs, immediate horse camping is compatible with the proposed renovation. The continued closure constitutes a public nuisance, one which affects the entire equestrian community. Action by the Board is necessary to provide use in the customary manner of a public park defined in Section 3479. Jurisdiction is within the Board of Supervisors to bring an action.

## California Code of Civil Procedure

731. An action may be brought by any person whose property is injuriously affected, or whose personal enjoyment is lessened by a

Nuisance, as the same is defined in section thirty-four hundred and seventy-nine **3479** of the Civil Code, and by the judgment in such action the nuisance may be enjoined or abated **as well as damages recovered**

Therefore, a civil action may be brought in the name of the people of the State of California to abate a public nuisance, as the same is defined in **section thirty-four hundred and eighty of the Civil Code**, by the district attorney of any county in which such nuisance exists, or by the city attorney of any town or city in which such nuisance exists, and each of said officers shall have concurrent right to bring such action for a public nuisance existing within a town or city, and such district attorney, or city attorney, **of any county** or city in which such nuisance exists **must bring such action whenever directed by the board of supervisors of such county** or whenever directed by the legislative authority of such town or city.

## California Civil Code sections 3479 -3480

3479. Anything which is injurious to health, including, but not limited to, the illegal sale of controlled substances, or is indecent or offensive to the senses, **or an obstruction to the free use of property, so as to interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property, or unlawfully obstructs the free passage or use, in the customary manner, of any navigable lake, or river, bay, stream, canal, or basin, or any public park, square, street, or highway, is a nuisance**

Section Thirty-four Hundred and Eighty. **A public nuisance is one which affects at the same time an entire community or neighborhood, or any considerable number of persons, although the extent of the annoyance or damage inflicted upon individuals**

## may be unequal

We just learned that there is a public comment period open from October 1 and ending on this Sunday October 30 on the Los Caballos project. Yikes! In regards to the EIR for the Los Caballos Equestrian Campground Project, the three draft proposals by EDAW are unacceptable, dangerous, not aesthetically pleasing, unsuitable for equestrian use, and damaging to the environment.

- \* Campsites offer no area for safely tacking up horses
- \* The layout is for a standard RV campground with sites one on top of the other
- \* Curbs are not suitable in equestrian facility
- \* Retaining walls are dangerous for horses
- \* A paved 20 foot wide road is unsuitable for horse activities
- \* One section is placed in a meadow environment prone to bogs in wet years
- \* Too much grading would be required in the proposed location
- \* There would be a lack of a rustic environment
  - Campsites are smaller than the existing sites .5 acre vs. .7 acre average
- \* Natural grades are flattened
- \* Proposed road at 20 feet compared to existing 8 feet creates too much grading
- \* Not a loop design, requires large turning area for rigs and a wider street
- \* More impact environmentally and culturally than the existing site where impact has already been made
- \* Lack of viable adjacent day use area
- \* Inferior recreational experience
- \* Our Los Caballos has never confused with a KOA campground.
- \* Why use a campground nobody will like when they love the one we have
- \* Construction site impact on perimeter = larger negative impact
- \* All back-in sites not acceptable
- \* Fewer pull-through sites than in existing in plan

In summary, I reject all 3 draft proposals and request that the promised proposal number 4, leaving the campground in its existing location, be considered and evaluated through an EIR.

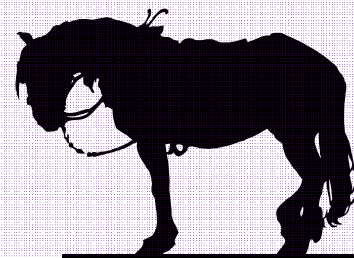
