Stacy Kuhns motioned that Redshank unit discontinue buying food for the monthly social rides. Audrey Turpin seconded the motion. Vote was 7-4 in favor of motion. Motion passes.

Trail Sign Report – Debbie Skinner. Debbie brings sample metal sign (approximate 12" long by 8" wide, brown background, white lettering). These signs cost \$20.00 for the graphics which are designed by Laurie Riggle and purchased through her. The painted sign and post for each trail sign is donated by Temecula Iron Works, owned by Ron Skinner (unit member) and Raul Zamora. Debbie suggested allocated funds for purchase of signs to be put in our region at locations decided by our unit. Stacy Kuhns suggests to ask for donations from members instead to purchase signs. Stacy, Kuhns, Audrey Turpin, Carol Schmuhl, and Gail McCreight offered to

donate \$20.00 each for signs. An article will be put in the newsletter asking for donations and naming those that have donated so far. Donations shall be made out to Redshank Riders and deposited by our treasurer. The unit will then purchase the sign graphics from Laurie Riggle.

New Business

Terri Pirillo suggests Amendment of Bylaws. Proposed changes will go before the membership via the September and October newsletter and then voted on at the October meeting.

Debbie Skinner suggests putting sections of the Zone Trails maps that Allison Renck has worked on all year in the newsletter in the form of a Trail of the month article. Everyone is in agreement.

Debbie Skinner discussed the virtues of discontinuing most of the strictly social rides and focusing on our unit's mission statement of "trail maintenance" and "educate horsemen and public about our trails". She would like to see the social rides and work parties be held at a trail head on the same date to encourage trail maintenance and education. Possibly even holding the monthly meeting at the trail head as well. In no way, stop the rides or make the ride strictly a work party. Would like the unit to come up with ways to hold a 2 hour ride in the morning from the staging area (trail head) and this group could report back regarding areas that need repair. Some members will choose just to ride, some may ride and also participate in the work party. Work party would be just for 2-3 hours and our unit gets credit for all the hours members work. Some members may elect to help in other ways, such as preparing food for the riders and workers, taking photos and documenting work being done, bringing supplies, writing articles, promotion or in other ways. If there is a monthly meeting and then a ride each month on a different day and then if we try to get back on track and focus on our mission statement of trail maintenance and education, this could take up multiple days per month which is not doable for most members due to time constraints. Debbie Skinner's motion to do away with strictly social rides and focus on our mission statement of trail maintenance will be tabled until 2008 as 2007 schedule has been set already. Further discussion is needed.

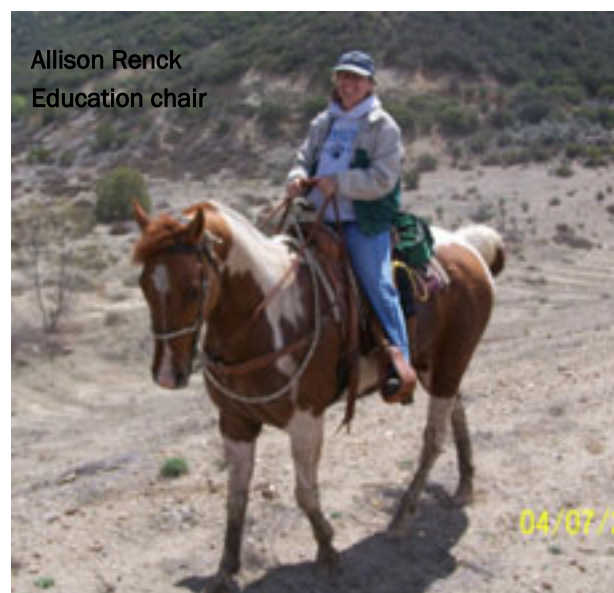

If the motion is to print the proposal in the newsletter then the vote on the proposal must be included in the agenda and voted on at the next consecutive meeting.

The vote may be taken either at the regularly scheduled meeting the proposal is turned into the Redshank Riders Units Board or at the next consecutive meeting. The proposal passes if Majority of members attending meeting vote aye.

Proposed Change #2

Change Ride coordinator title to include reference to trail maintenance (mission statement) The duties of this position are self explanatory. This person will focus on coordinating Trail Maintenance and rides to synergistically exist with our mission statement focusing on our appointed demographic and geographical areas.

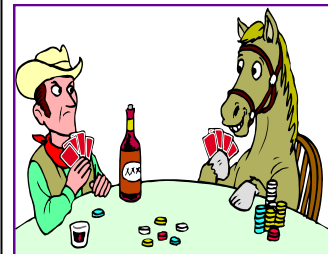

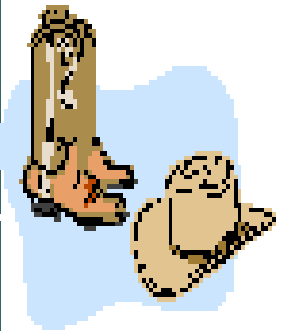

MCCALL PARK IN IDYLLWILD BY DEBBIE SKINNER

This is a beautiful place to camp With your horses, located in the mountains near Idyllwild. There are many miles of trails that pass through Oaks, pines and meadows. There is a nice 2 hour ride heading north on the fire brake trail where the trail crosses Hwy 241. East on the fire control road to the USFS station. There cross Hwy 241 again heading west back to Mc Call Rd. continue east back to the fire break trail. From there head south to camp. There are some 45-50 corrals and a large area for camping. They do not take individual reservations but they will reserve for groups of 12 or more. For group reservations call Riverside County parks 1-800-234-7275 The Park is located approximately 1 mile west of Mountain Center off Highway 74.

Deer Springs Trail to top of Suicide Rock – 6.6 miles taking 3 ½ hours or so with lunch at the top of Suicide Rock. Trail starts through Manzanita grove becoming more forested. At top of Suicide Rock, phenomenal vistas in all directions. Starts at 5600 ft elevation, climbing to 6900 at the trail junction, ending at 7500 at the top.

Permit required: Get permit at State Park offices located on Hwy 243 just as leaving Idyllwild toward Pine Cove on your left. Park rigs on the right side of Hwy 243 to walk in (not enough room for rigs in parking lot). Proceed north on Hwy 243 to the Nature Center about 1 mile on your left. Turn into drive, parking off pavement on left and/or proceed around to right and park on right alongside "island" with trash barrels

and downed tree. If parking is not available, may park in wide area along highway (not as desirable) with an Adventure Pass. Trailhead is across the highway (pass by on either end wood railing along other side of highway). Take care in crossing especially on your return; listen for traffic as there is not good line-of-sight coming back.

* Follow trail, wide at first and then narrows as turns to the right after about 400 yds.

* After passing sign "entering San Jacinto State Park" up a little bit there are two foot paths out to vistas that are a nice family hike destination.

* Trail has some technical footing but no drop offs. Good for green stock and people who don't like heights.

* At 2.3 miles turn right to Suicide Rock. Just before trail intersection

has nice places for picnic.

* Trail is less steep incline but has some drop offs. Just before a stream crossing, there is a narrow rock crossing that we suggest you dismount and lead horse across. Water available almost always. Nice area to dismount and mount on each side of rock.

* Proceed to top of rock (all dirt) bearing right to a cluster of small trees suitable for tying horses.

* Walk out on rock top (explore a bit) to have lunch-with-a-view. Return same way you came remembering to dismount just past stream crossing to lead over rock. azaleas.

Cahuilla Mountain Trail Work Party Date TBA at September meeting

Directions: Exit in Temecula onto Hwy 79S toward Warner Springs; you will pass Vail Lake Resort and many ranch homes along

the highway. Once reaching Aguanga approx 20 miles later, turn left onto Hwy 371 for Anza. Continue on Hwy 371 up a long slow grade to about 4500' through the dry rocky terrain of Anza Valley, you will immediately see Cahuilla Mountain boasting splendid granite walls. In approx 11.5 miles, you will turn left onto Cary Road.

The Finer Details - Once on

Cary Rd driving through residential area, watch for a fork in the road in about 3.8 miles, with a sign for "Tripp Flats." Turn left onto a dirt road; take caution, this road is barely wide enough to pass two cars. Just about a mile further, Tripp Flats Station gate will appear at a fork in the road, turn left here and pass through a different gate; continue for another mile and half to a saddle with obvious parking area. Also, be aware that this gate may be locked during heavy rains or fire season, which adds over a mile one way to your hike. A large sign

for the Cahuilla Mountain Trail is on the left side of the road; park in this lot.

Remember, there is something for everyone at a work party. We need people with cooking skills (we all got to eat!), erosion control, those that can help organize, pack in equipment, work with tools (power and hand trimmers), some people may be able to supply equipment or food, but not able to stay (that's great too).
